

CORONAVIRUS (COVID-19) STAY SAFE APPROACH 12 AUGUST 2021

Jane's COVID-19 'Stay Safe' approach aims to establish a COVID safe community at the College and is implemented in direct response to recent events occurring in Tasmania, such as a new positive case of COVID-19, border status changes, etc. The College's approach may change within an hour's notice so please check this page regularly.

As at 5:00pm Thursday 12 August 2021, the following College rules and guidelines for all students are temporarily implemented until further notice:

- Travel is discouraged where possible. Coronavirus needs a body to move in the community, so when bodies move, the virus moves.
- Visitors may visit the College but must register their visit by checking in via the Check In TAS QR code, displayed at most building entrances around the College.
- Visitors feeling unwell or with any cold and flu symptoms should not visit the College.
- Good hand hygiene should be practised at all times. Hand sanitiser is available in shared locations around the College.
- Be prepared in the case of a lockdown. Have your own personal supply of masks ready.
- All other standard COVID practices apply.
- The College continues to follow Federal and State Government Public Health guidelines.
- Remain in your room if you are sick and contact the Office or Duty Phone on 0412 905 034. Illness procedures are to be followed all year until further notice.



Alert Levels at Jane Franklin Hall

The College will follow a 3 level alert status. Green being the New Normal, Amber being Caution and Red being High Alert.

Upon the notification of a status change in Tasmania, the Principal and Dean of Students will consult on the current Alert Level and make a decision as to whether restrictions need to be implemented and Alert Levels raised.

Alert Levels can be raised immediately at any time by the Principal and the Dean of Students but can only be lowered by the Emergency Management Committee (EMC).

The following are examples of events that may be cause to raise an Alert Level:

- New Active COVID-19 cases in Tasmania
- Introduction of new State Restrictions
- Opening of State Borders
- Opening of International Borders
- Tasmanian Outbreaks of COVID-19
- Suspected Active Case identified at the College
- New variant of the virus arising
- Any new Risk elements identified

The following are examples of restrictions that Jane may bring into place at the College in response to emerging situations:

- Closing the College Gates and restricting access
- The banning of guests and non-essential visitors
- The banning of group gatherings
- Physical distancing rules for the dining hall and common areas
- Student and Staff access restrictions



GREEN

Green is the new normal. College is to remain alert and follow all government rules and guidelines. Maintain all basic hygiene requirements and physical distancing as required.

Amber

Amber is alerting everyone to be cautious due to recent events. It is an alert status that means some restrictions are in place above what is required by the State Government. This is likely to be minor restrictions such closing the gates and restricting access to the College. It may also involve some extra physical distancing requirements in the College.

Red

Red is to inform the College to be at high alert. This alert will likely be in response to a severe local event such as a Hobart outbreak of COVID-19 or a student or staff member testing positive to COVID-19. This means the College is likely to go into a hard lockdown with limited access to non-Jane students and staff.
