



### The Scholarship

Offered by alumnus of the College, Senator Jonathon Duniam, the scholarship is for returning undergraduate residents of the College who have a demonstrated interest in politics, governance, civics or public administration. It aims to tackle youth apathy for politics and the political process.

The successful scholarship recipient will also have the opportunity to complete an internship in Senator Duniam's office and may include attendance at one sitting week in Canberra. The successful applicant may be required to pay their own costs full or part costs towards airfares and accommodation in Canberra should a Canberra-based internship be offered.

Valued at \$2500, payable towards fees at College, students of any political persuasion are welcome to apply.

The successful applicant is also expected to demonstrate high levels of personal and professional integrity and behaviour, in line with the high standards of behaviour expected of anyone holding public office.

### To Apply

1. Complete the application form.
2. Attach a current resume outlining studies (current and/or past), any work experience, interests and involvement with organisations, committees or groups.

### The Selection Process

To be considered for a scholarship at Jane Franklin Hall, students should also have applied for residency of Jane prior to 9.00am on the **22 November 2019**.

The Jane Franklin Hall Scholarships Committee meets in late November and in the second week of January of each year to determine scholarship recipients. Final approval for scholarships is determined by donors where applicable.

The College liaises with the University Scholarship office to ensure wide distribution of scholarships, although scholarships applicants are encouraged to apply for as many scholarships as they are eligible for.

Successful applicants are notified by e-mail as soon as practicable by late January 2020, although it is possible that some recipients may not be informed until the beginning of Semester 1. The Committee's decisions are final and no further correspondence will be entered into. Unfortunately due to the tight timeframes we work on, unsuccessful applicants will not be contacted.

All scholarship recipients must be residents at Jane in 2020. Withdrawal from the College will mean forfeiture of the scholarship. Unfortunately, due to the nature of funding for scholarships, deferrals of scholarships are not permitted.
