

In partnership with benefactors from around the world, Jane Franklin Hall provides tens of thousands of dollars annually to its residents in the form of scholarships.

Scholarships are crucial to achieving our purpose, allowing talent and motivation to be the guiding principles for entry into Jane and not personal circumstances or financial constraint.

Scholarships are awarded on specific criteria for each scholarship. For some scholarships, the amount of money awarded varies according to monetary interest rates and the generosity of particular donors.

Scholarships are paid as a remission of fees and students are encouraged to apply for as many scholarships as possible.

Scholarship in Health Sciences NEW

Value: \$15,000 per year for up to three years

Available to a commencing university student, who is an Australian citizen or permanent resident, undertaking any Bachelor degree through the University of Tasmania's College of Health and Medicine and entering Jane in Semester 1, 2024. This includes but is not limited to medicine, nursing, pharmacy, and biomedical sciences. The scholarship will be awarded based on academic potential, financial need and the capacity and willingness to contribute positively to the Jane community. The scholarship is made possible through the donation of an anonymous benefactor.

Marcus Freeman Scholarship in Business NEW

Value: \$10,000 for one year

Offered to a commencing university student who is an Australian citizen or permanent resident, undertaking a Bachelor of Business at the University of Tasmania and entering Jane in Semester 1, 2024. The scholarship will be awarded based on financial need and the capacity and willingness to contribute positively to the Jane community. Donated by alumnus of the College, Marcus Freeman



Dr Karla Fenton OAM Scholarship in Medicine NEW

Value: \$15,000 per year for up to three years

Offered to a commencing university student who is an Australian citizen or permanent resident, undertaking a Bachelor of Medical Science and Doctor of Medicine at the University of Tasmania College of Health and Medicine and entering Jane in Semester 1, 2024. The successful candidate must demonstrate academic potential, leadership potential within the field of medicine and the capacity and willingness to contribute positively to the Jane community. Funded by Dr Douglas Fenton-Lee in honour of his mother, Fellow Emerita of the College, Dr Karla Fenton OAM.

Who is Dr Karla Fenton OAM?

A Fellow Emerita of Jane Franklin Hall, Dr Karla Fenton OAM was born in New Norfolk and completed 62 years in medical practice before retiring in June 2016 at the age of 90.

After completing her war service in the air force, Dr Fenton retrained as a doctor, graduating from Melbourne University in the early 1950s. Karla's medical career then took her to Malaysia where she became the physician in charge of looking after officials, including the Malaysian Royal Family. She returned to Tasmania, joining the Tasmanian Psychiatric Service in 1969.

In her distinguished career Dr Fenton worked in adult psychiatry, the Combined Children's Centre, Youth Counselling and was Superintendent of the Alcohol and Drug Treatment Centres at the John Edis, Royal Hobart and Royal Derwent Hospitals. She also worked at Clare House in Child and Adolescent Psychiatry, was Acting Regional Psychiatrist on the North West Coast and was a Forensic Examiner for the Sexual Assault Medical Services. A concern for the effects of drugs and alcohol on young people and veterans saw Dr Fenton instigate and coordinate the Maturity and Youth (M-Y) program for drug affected families in the 1990s.

The Anzac of the Year Award 2005 (Tasmania) and the Senior Australian of the Year (Tasmania) in 2004 were awarded to Dr Fenton and she continues as a Patron of Soroptimists International Hobart and a Convenor for Assisted Dying Group. She is also featured in the 'Women of the Island: Stories from Tasmania" online project.

Meeting her husband Professor David Elliott at Jane, Dr Fenton has been involved with the College since the 1970s. She has been a valued benefactor, supporter and friend, offering a Travelling Scholarship (since discontinued) and establishing a trust to award an annual prize to a high-performing international student. Dr Fenton's significant contribution to the College was recognised by the naming of the new Dr Karla Fenton OAM wing after her. Now her son, Douglas Fenton-Lee, himself a distinguished surgeon, is honouring his mother by donating this new scholarship. We could not think of a more fitting tribute to someone who continues to inspire us.



Jane Community Scholarship

Value: \$10,000 per year for up to three years

Offered to two Tasmanian students, who are entering University in 2024 and are in their final year of school in 2023. While applicants must have received sound academic results from year 11, the most important criteria for this scholarship are about demonstrating good character and the potential to contribute positively to the College community. As this is a community-focused award, shortlisted applicants will be required to attend an interview at the College, preferably in person in Hobart.

Available to a commencing student undertaking a Bachelor of Medical Science and Doctor of Medicine in Semester 1, 2024 who was educated in the north or northwest of Tasmania and who will need financial assistance to move away from home to undertake study. The student must be entering Jane Franklin Hall for the first time in 2024. Donated by Dr Hilary Wallace and the late Dr Alan Wallace.

Value: \$4000 per year for up to three years

Jill and Wayne Habner Scholarship

Value: \$8,000

For a student commencing a Bachelor degree in any subject and who has completed their school studies at Launceston College, achieving outstanding academic results. In awarding the scholarship, financial need will also be considered. The scholarship is provided by Jane Franklin Hall and Launceston College alumnus, Mark Habner, and is named in honour of his parents. The funding is for one year.

Damon Courtenay Memorial Scholarship

Value: \$1,000

For a first-year student studying a Bachelor degree in any subject. The funding is for one year. Selection is based on financial need and academic potential. Endowed by author, the late Bryce Courtenay in memory of his son, Damon.

Scholarships open to students returning to college in 2024

Kate Gilder Scholarship

Value: \$8,000

Offered for one year to a returning female resident enrolled in any Bachelor program who shows leadership, encourages others and has made a significant contribution to College life. Satisfactory academic achievement is important but the concept of "having a go" and achieving a balance in life between study, the outdoors and community participation is considered more important with this award. Endowed by Rosey and Sarah Gilder in memory of their sister, Kate.

Audrey Lee Scholarship

Value: \$3,000

Offered for one year to a returning Tasmanian student in second or subsequent years of undergraduate study in the College of Health and Medicine. Selection criteria include financial need and academic performance. Endowed by the late Bill Craig in honour of his wife Audrey Lee, a former Fellow and foundation student of the College in 1950. The funding is for one year.



Fellows' Scholarship

Value: \$3,000

Offered to a returning student enrolled in any Bachelor degree, the selection criteria being academic success and service to the College. The funding is for one year. Donated by the Fellows of Jane Franklin Hall.

Applications for the 2024 calendar year close on 31 October 2023, except for the Jane Community Scholarships which close at 9.00am on 18 September 2023.



To be considered for a scholarship at Jane Franklin Hall, students must have applied for residency of Jane prior to 9.00am on the 31 October 2023. The exception to this is for applicants for the Jane Community Scholarships, who must have applied for residency before 9.00am on 18 September 2023. Those who have submitted an application for a scholarship but have not submitted an application for residency at the College by the due date will not be considered for a scholarship.

The Jane Franklin Hall Scholarships Committee meets in October, late November and in the second week of January each year to determine scholarship recipients. Successful applicants are notified by e-mail as soon as practicable after those meetings, although it is possible that some recipients may not be informed until the beginning of Semester 1 2024. The exception to this is for applicants for the Jane Community Scholarships who must attend an interview with the Scholarships Committee in early 2023 with a view to successful recipients being offered scholarships in October 2023.

Selection of the successful recipients is undertaken by assessing all those who applied for scholarships. Students who do not apply cannot be considered even if their results were higher than those received by the scholarship winner.

Scholarships applicants are encouraged to apply for as many Jane and University scholarships as they are eligible for.

The Committee's decisions are final and no further correspondence will be entered into. Unfortunately, due to the tight timeframes we work on, unsuccessful applicants will not be contacted.

All scholarship recipients must be residents at Jane in 2024. Withdrawal from the College will mean forfeiture of the scholarship.

Unfortunately, due to the nature of funding for scholarships, deferrals of scholarships are not permitted.
