THE PROGRAM OFFERS

- Full Membership of Student Club, including voting rights
- Student Club Activities, including social events like the annual College Ball and sporting activities
- Student leadership opportunities through the Student Club sub-committees such as MADD Committee (Music, Art, Dance and Drama) or the Fresher Committee
- 20% discount on casual accommodation
- 20 meals (lunch or dinner) per semester
- All Formal Dinners throughout the semester – your own Hogwarts experience
- The loan of an academic gown for formal dinners at no cost
- Support from the Dean of Students
- Access to Positive Solutions counselling and psychology services
- Support from the Dean of Academic Studies for academic advice
- Access to regularly scheduled Academic Mentor sessions, tutorials, residential Micro Courses, and Intercambio
- A pass for the Jane bus
- Plain Sheet weekly newsletter and in College Facebook Groups

The small print: Terms and Conditions of Associate Membership

1. The Associate Program is available to those:
 - students of the University of Tasmania who do not live at Jane and may wish to have an association with the College while living in other accommodation;
 - past students of Jane who are still students at the University of Tasmania and would like to continue their association with the College.
2. Once we have your enrolment, we'll send you a conditional offer, to be confirmed once payment is received and a signed Code of Conduct has been received.
3. Associate membership costs \$1100 per semester. A 10% discount per semester will apply to students who enrol for 2 semesters up front.
4. Casual accommodation is for accommodation at Jane for a maximum of 1-6 consecutive nights. For more than 6 nights, the usual semester weekly rate will apply.
5. No more than one series of 6 consecutive nights is permitted as an Associate member.
6. The casual accommodation rate includes breakfast and bed linen.
7. The 12 meals can be for lunch or dinner but they do not include a formal dinner. Meal vouchers for more meals can be purchased from the Office.
Associate members are invited to all formal dinners, the cost of which is included in the Associate Membership package. Associate Members are provided with the dates in advance and are requested to apologise for non-attendance to the Registrar at registrar@jane.edu.au by 2pm of the day of the formal dinner.
8. The Associate Membership will cover the period starting first week of Semester and will expire the Saturday after the end of semester exams.
9. As casual guests, students are expected to abide by the same terms and conditions as a full-fee paying student. Those obligations are outlined in the Jane Student Handbook as College Obligations and Terms of Residence (COTR).
10. Associate members of Jane are also expected to sign an Associate Member Code of Conduct before a full offer can be made.
11. Associate membership is at the discretion of the College and may be refused for a number of reasons including but not limited to non-payment of semester fees, or poor behaviour whilst at College.
12. The College reserves the right to cancel Associate membership due to breaches of the Code of Conduct or the COTR. In such a situation a refund for remaining fees may be offered minus a \$220 cancellation fee plus any fines or charges levied by the College.
13. Withdrawal from the Associate Membership during before the conclusion of the agreement needs to be in writing to the registrar@jane.edu.au and will incur a cancellation fee of \$220.
14. Should you choose to transfer from an Associate Membership to full residency, we'll waive the cancellation fee and apply any remaining credit towards your full fee payment.
15. Tutorial support is subject to tutor availability and limited to two sessions of two hours duration each. Additional tutorial sessions may be purchased by Associate Members at \$105.72 per two-hour session, also subject to tutor availability.

16. Mentor sessions, Micro-credentials and tutorials will mostly be organized as group sessions as far as possible.
17. Payment can be made in a number of ways:
 - Upfront payment of the whole via credit card or direct bank deposit
 - Transferring the remains of your room deposit or credit to your membership and paying the rest upon receipt of an invoice from the College.
